On 18th September 2023, the Law department of Trinity Institute of Professional Studies organized ***orientation session on moot court and memorial making*** to understand the functioning and drafting of moot court and real life court cases.

Main Objectives of the session were as follows:

Moot court and memorial making orientation sessions are designed to prepare participants for the challenges and requirements of moot court competitions.

- Understanding Moot Court Structure:

Familiarize participants with the overall structure and format of moot court competitions. This includes the different rounds, roles of participants (appellant, respondent, judges), and the scoring criteria.

- Legal Research Skills:

Develop participants' legal research skills by introducing them to relevant legal databases, case law, statutes, and other legal resources. Provide guidance on how to effectively navigate and use these resources to build strong legal arguments.

- Memorial Writing Techniques:

Teach participants the art of writing persuasive memorials (legal briefs). This involves instructing them on proper formatting, citation styles, and the essential components of a memorial, such as statement of facts, legal issues, arguments, and conclusions.

- Oral Advocacy Skills:

Help participants enhance their oral advocacy skills, including effective communication, public speaking, and the ability to respond to questions from judges. Conduct practice sessions to simulate the moot court environment.

- Legal Analysis and Critical Thinking:

Encourage participants to develop strong analytical and critical thinking skills. Emphasize the importance of constructing well-reasoned arguments, identifying relevant legal principles, and addressing counterarguments.

- Professionalism and Courtroom Etiquette:

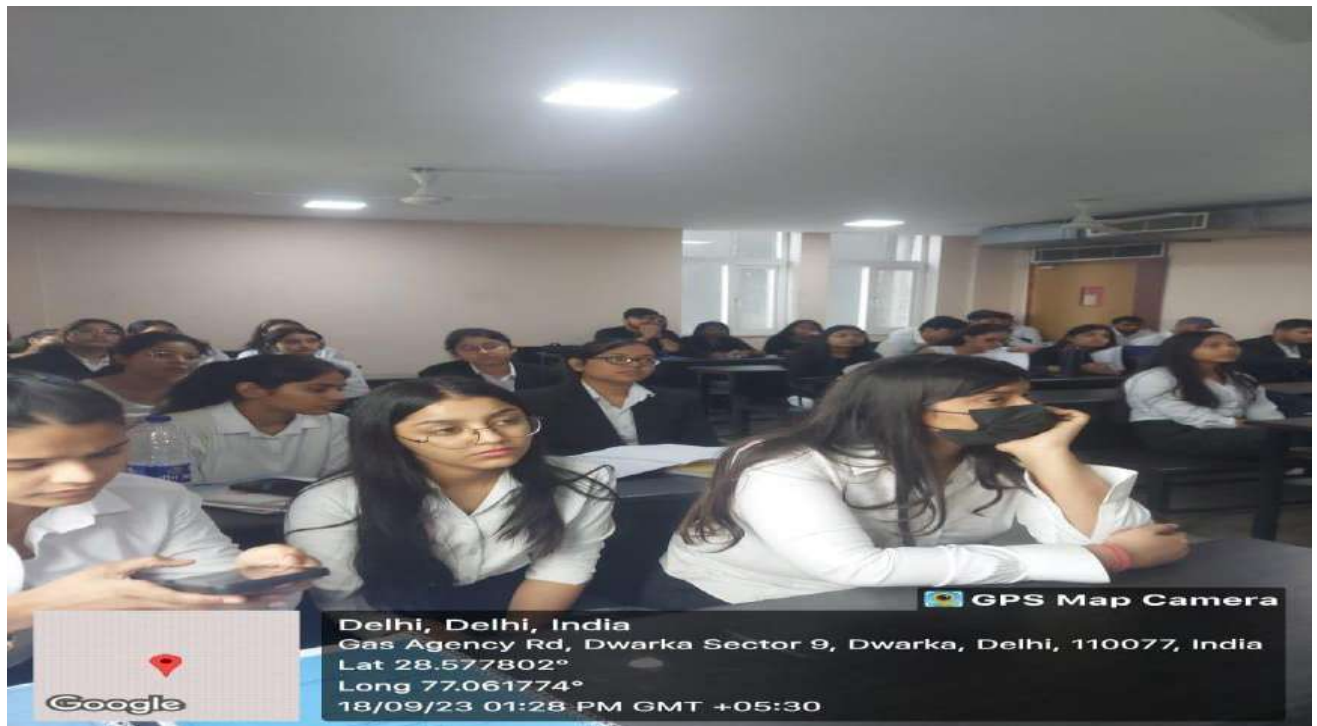
Instil a sense of professionalism and courtroom etiquette. Provide guidance on proper behaviour, addressing judges, and interacting with opposing counsel. Emphasize the importance of maintaining a respectful and composed demeanour during the competition.

- Teamwork and Collaboration:

Foster a sense of teamwork and collaboration among participants. Moot court competitions often involve teams working together to prepare memorials and present oral arguments. Encourage effective communication and division of responsibilities within the team.

The session commenced with a welcome address by the faculty convenor of the moot court society Ms. Gaurika Sharma, providing an overview of the importance of moot court competitions in legal education. The senior students led a detailed analysis of the moot court problem for the upcoming competition. Key legal issues, relevant laws, and the hypothetical scenario were discussed to ensure a comprehensive understanding among participants. The participants were introduced to various legal databases, case law, and statutes. Faculties being experienced legal writers, conducted a workshop on memorial writing. The structure of a legal brief, including the statement of facts, legal issues, arguments, and conclusion, was discussed in detail.

A question-and-answer session post these guidelines were asked to clarify doubts and seek further insights into specific topics. The illustrations and the basic knowledge about the trial cases was perfect for making the students clear about the basics of courtroom. The faculty convenor made sure that the students took part enthusiastically and hence she posed questions as well as shared her insights. The students were extremely lad to listen and grasp the knowledge which the dignitaries had to offer.

Memorial Making Competition

On 19th September 2023, the Law department of Trinity Institute of Professional Studies organized a ***memorial making competition*** to understand the functioning and drafting of memorial for moot court and real life court cases.

Main Objectives of the session were as follows:

The objectives of a memorial making competition in moot court are multifaceted and aim to develop various skills and qualities essential for law students. Here are several key objectives:

- **Legal Research Skills:**
To enhance participants' proficiency in legal research techniques.

The competition encourages students to delve into legal databases, statutes, and case law to develop a thorough understanding of the legal issues presented in the moot court problem.
- **Analytical Thinking and Problem Solving:**
To foster participants' ability to analyze complex legal issues critically.

Crafting a memorial requires participants to identify relevant legal principles, assess factual scenarios, and propose effective legal arguments, thereby enhancing their analytical and problem-solving skills.
- **Legal Writing Proficiency:**
To improve participants' legal writing and communication skills.

The competition challenges participants to articulate legal arguments clearly, concisely, and persuasively in the form of a memorial, developing their ability to communicate complex legal concepts effectively.

- **Understanding Legal Ethics:**

To instill a sense of legal ethics and professionalism.

Participants are expected to adhere to ethical standards while presenting their memorials, promoting a sense of professionalism and integrity in legal practice.

- **Preparation for Advocacy:**

To prepare students for the oral advocacy component of moot court competitions.

Memorial making serves as a precursor to oral advocacy by requiring participants to thoroughly understand and articulate legal arguments, providing a foundation for the subsequent oral rounds.

- **Team Collaboration:**

To encourage teamwork and collaboration.

Many memorial making competitions involve team submissions, fostering collaboration and effective communication among team members. This mirrors the teamwork required in actual legal practice.

The competition was conducted after taking session upon memorial making and basic introduction of a moot court problem by the faculty convenor of the moot court society Ms. Gaurika Sharma. The students were asked to make memorials of the plaintiff and respondent's side in order to understand and defend case from both the sides. The case scenario were discussed to ensure a comprehensive understanding among participants. The participants were introduced to various legal databases, case law, and statutes. Faculties being experienced legal writers, conducted a workshop on memorial writing.

The structure of a legal brief, including the statement of facts, legal issues, arguments, and conclusion was expected to be drafted by the students as taught to them.

Ms. Gaurika Sharma also took a question and answer session regarding the conduct and marks of the participants. The students also made up their teams of three which consisted of two speakers and one researcher so that they can participate in the intra moot court scheduled as their next event. Students participated with great enthusiasm and the competition proved to be insightful for the students

Trinity Moot Court Society, Department of Legal Studies of Trinity Institute of professional Studies organized its 4th edition of moot court competition on 1st & 2nd December 2023. There were 12 teams which participated in the competition, the competition was specifically conducted for 1st year and 2nd year students to harness their advocacy and research skills.

Moot court competitions serve as dynamic platforms for law students to engage in simulated legal proceedings, arguing hypothetical cases to attain a comprehensive range of skills and experiences. These competitions necessitate participants to delve into intensive legal research and analysis, exploring issues, statutes, and case law relevant to the hypothetical scenarios. Through this, participants cultivate robust analytical skills. Additionally, moot court participation provides a practical understanding of legal procedures, courtroom etiquette, and the overarching structure of legal proceedings, mirroring the realities of a courtroom setting.

Emphasis on oral advocacy within moot court competitions demands participants to articulate their arguments persuasively, fostering the development of public speaking, communication, and persuasion skills. Furthermore, participants are tasked with honing their legal writing abilities by crafting precise and coherent legal memoranda and briefs that effectively present complex arguments. The nature of moot court problems, often entailing intricate legal issues, encourages critical thinking and creative problem-solving, refining participants' ability to analyze situations and construct sound legal arguments.

Collaboration is a key facet of many moot court competitions, where teams of students work together, promoting teamwork and coordination to present a unified and effective case. The competitions instill a sense of professionalism and ethical conduct, requiring

participants to adhere to the standards of the legal profession, respect opponents, observe courtroom etiquette, and uphold integrity.

The incorporation of legal issues from diverse jurisdictions in moot court problems exposes participants to different legal systems and perspectives, broadening their understanding of the law on an international or comparative level. As participants present arguments in a simulated courtroom setting, they concurrently build confidence in their legal knowledge, public speaking abilities, and overall professional demeanor. Constructive feedback from judges, coaches, or peers during these competitions plays a pivotal role in facilitating continuous improvement, allowing participants to identify areas for refinement and honing their legal skills. Intra- moot court competitions function as invaluable experiential learning tools, equipping law students with the skills necessary to navigate the challenges of their future legal careers. These competitions foster a deeper understanding and appreciation for the intricacies of the legal process while simultaneously providing a holistic and immersive learning experience.

On the first day, the proceedings kicked off with an inaugural ceremony that included a comprehensive briefing for all participating teams on the event's rules and regulations. The draw of lots determined the courtroom allocations for the respective teams, and a memorandum exchange took place. The competition unfolded through two preliminary rounds, each presided over by distinguished judges, namely Ms. Aishwarya, Dr. Sonika, and Mr. Amit. Following the conclusion of these rounds, eight teams were eliminated, leaving four to advance to the semifinals. Additionally, a researcher test was conducted at the conclusion of the second preliminary round.

Second Day commenced with the drawing of lots and the exchange of memorials for the semi-finals. The semi-final rounds took place in two separate locations, namely the Moot Court Room/Court Room No. 1 and Room No. 707/Court No. 2. Ms. Sonkashi Kashyap and Ms. Chahat Abrol served as judges for the semi-final proceedings. Following intense competition, two teams, T-08 and T-12, emerged victorious and qualified for the finals. In the finals, the petitioner and respondent teams presented compelling arguments in favor of their respective positions. The judging criteria encompassed factors such as knowledge of facts, presentation skills, time management, the use of legal authority, and performance in the rebuttal round. The winners of the competition were as follows:

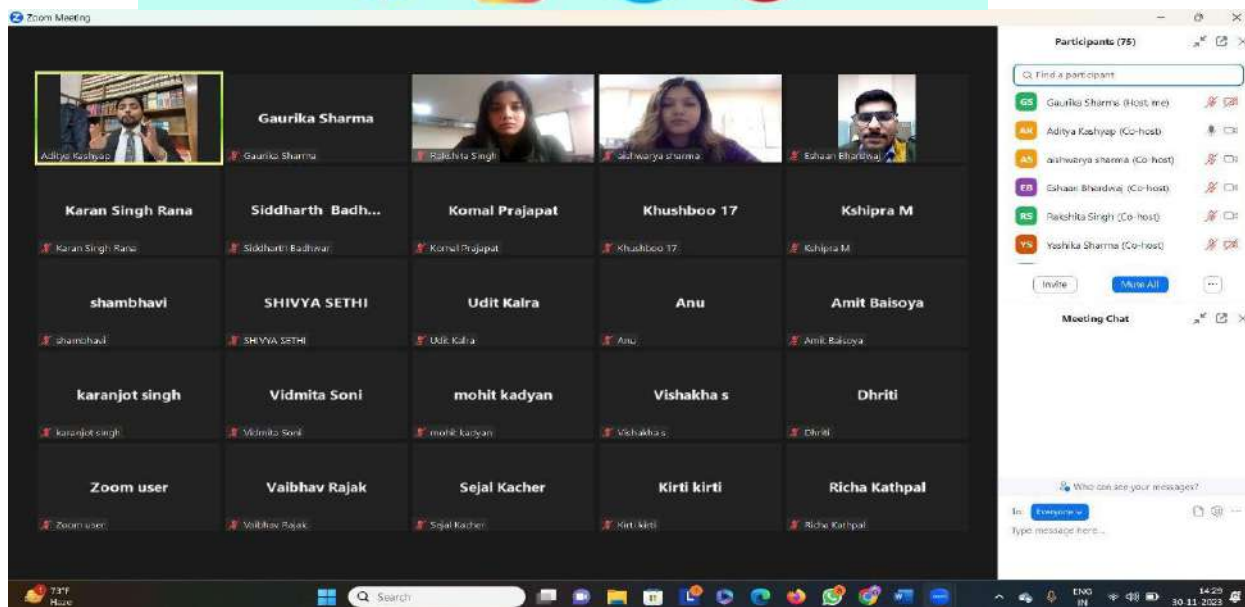

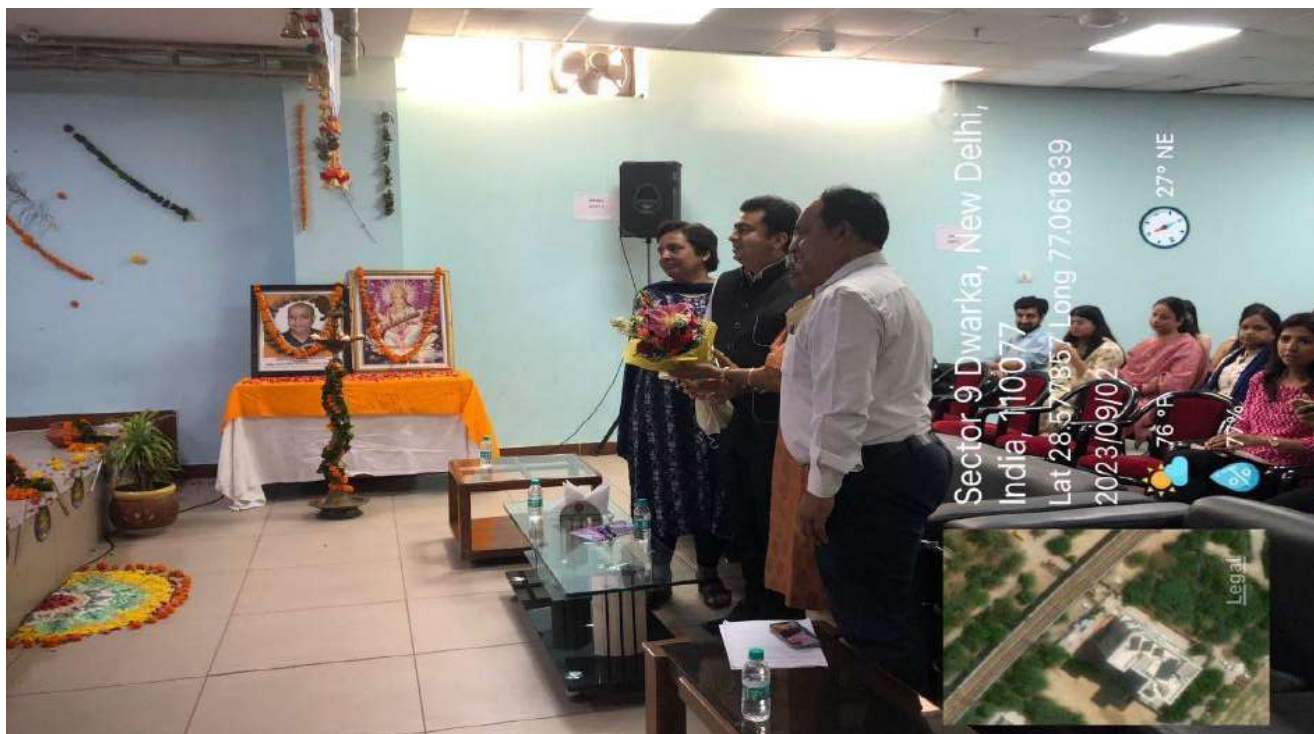

VISIT TO CYBER CELL

On 8th August 2023, the Law department of Trinity Institute of Professional Studies organized a ***Visit to the Cyber cell*** in collaboration with Delhi State Legal Services Authority to understand the workings of this specialized unit and its role in addressing cybercrimes and maintaining digital security.

Main Objectives of the Visit were as follows:

- Gain insights into the functioning of the Cyber Cell and its significance in the realm of cybersecurity.
- Understand the techniques employed by the Cyber Cell for cybercrime detection, prevention, and investigation.
- Learn about the collaboration between the Cyber Cell and other law enforcement agencies, as well as its role in legal proceedings related to cybercrimes.
-

The visit began with an overview of the Cyber Cell's mandate, organizational structure, and key responsibilities. A comprehensive discussion highlighting the evolving nature of cyber threats, common attack vectors, and recent trends. The students discussed about - Network forensic, Data recovery, Mobile forensic there types and crypto security's. The Cyber Cell team provided a hands-on demonstration of various tools and techniques used for digital forensics, malware analysis, and incident response. Representatives from the Cyber Cell and the Law Department engaged in a dialogue about the legal aspects of cybercrime investigation and the collaboration between law enforcement and legal experts.

The officers highlighted the view on some guidelines for the students like-

1. Be selective about what information you make public. Be cautious while posting online any information that can personally identify you, a family member, or friend on a public site like

a blog, or online white pages, or job hunt sites, or in any other place. Anyone on the Internet can see the information. Sensitive information includes real name, date of birth, gender, town, e-mail address, school name, place of work, and personal photos. Fraudsters, cheats and online perverts can misuse this information to your detriment

2. Pay attention to the risks associated with e-mails. and think twice before you open attachments or click links in e-mail-**even if you know the sender**-as these can be used to transmit spam and viruses to your computer. Never respond to e-mail asking you to provide personal information, especially your account number or password, even if it seems to be from a business you trust. Reputable businesses will not ask you this information in e-mail. Never click on links provided in an email, unless you are sure of the sender and the purpose of email. Instead, use a search engine to find the site. Don't forward spam, whether it's a cute 'thought of the day', 'set of jokes', 'amazing photo', 'recipe tree' or similar email, if you don't personally know the sender. The email may be a scam designed to collect the email accounts – and relationships – of everyone you share it with.
3. Never, try to meet a person with whom you've interacted only online without taking somebody else along and such meeting must always be in a public place. Remember, people are not always who they say they are. People often feel uncomfortable setting safety boundaries because they don't want to offend someone; but good intentioned people will understand and encourage you to set safety requirements, and it is the crooks who want you to feel guilty about it.
4. Know the Privacy Policy and Terms of Service of any service you use. Create an environment of safety for yourself by understanding how a website that you use, treats your privacy and information. That fine print may tell you the company can own, resell, rent, or give your information to anyone they want. If it does that then find a more respectful site.

A question-and-answer session post these guidelines were asked to clarify doubts and seek further insights into specific topics. The illustrations and the basic knowledge about the cyber cases was perfect for making the students clear about the basics of cell. The police officer made sure that the students took part enthusiastically and hence he posed questions as well as shared his insights. The students were extremely glad to listen and grasp the knowledge which the dignitaries had to offer.

Visit to Tihar Jail

Date	9 th August 2023
Topic	Visit to Tihar Jail

Law department of Trinity Institute of Professional Studies, Dwarka conducted a visit to Tihar Jail on August 9, 2023. It was an educational activity where the students received a first hand experience of working of the jail and conditions of inmates serving their sentence.

Since it is a mandatory call for students of legal studies to know the procedures carried out in jails and involvement of an advocate in such procedures, they were given a chance to witness:

- Legal aid cell
- Prison cell
- Weaving factory
- Tasks given to inmates

For a law student, practical knowledge of legal procedure is a stepping stone to his foundation of legal knowledge and understanding. Visits to Jail, Police station, Court and other centres serves a first hand experience of not only the procedure but also the criteria of service. Hence the students sought information on procedure upon conviction, the structure of jail, approach of imprisonment towards a prisoner, creation of finances for jail, provision for court directed punishment and so on.

Active interaction, question hour and inter group discussion regarding and during the visit among the students and with legal authorities help exposed them to a variety of different ideas which boosted their thinking and argumentative skills. An enhancement of soft skills like confidence during such visit also allowed ideas and views of a person to be put forward.

Located in Janakpuri approximately 3 kilometres from the village of Tihar lies India's largest and most guarded prison complex run by the government of Delhi which has 9 functional prisons spread over more than 400 acres of land.

Tihar, built in 1958 was a maximum-security prison run by the State of Punjab but in 1966 the control and regulation of the jail was transferred to the National Capital Territory of Delhi. In 1984, through the construction of additional facilities, it gained the status of the largest existing prison in India with a housing capacity of 10,026. The reason for such heavy capacity is the efficient division of prisoners in multiple jails. There are jails from No 1 to 6 where Jail No 3 has the highest capacity. Males and females are kept separately along with different cells for high profile prisoners and those on death row.

After the completion of the security check, the students entered the area of the prison through a gate which from the inside was painted by inmates, representing graffiti of India Gate.

To the left of students was a room where inmates were called by names who had come after trial or bail. It was also observed that inmates were indulged in activities like idol making, painting and decoration related work.

The first section that students paid a visit to, was of weaving (handloom and powerloom) where they were given a brief of how inmates produce fabric and how other substances like Mustard oil is produced. Tihar Jail is famous for the fine quality of goods produced by inmates which are for sale outside the prison complex. On the walls of the weaving factory were quotes of wisdom that were meant to spread positive energy and create a good ambiance for work.

Later the group of students proceeded towards the sitting area to address queries related to the legal arena of the prison complex and facilities existing during which they were provided with refreshments. On the way to the sitting areas were seen the dispensary which were equipped with medicines and supplies for immediate treatment in case of an emergency.

The discussion with prison authorities revealed that inmates had fixed timings to roam outside after the lapse of which they were made to return to their cells. There was also a mention of separate cells for women, juveniles and high risk criminals because during the visit no female inmate was spotted by students. The prison complex was designed to have cells divided on the basis of age in order to separate those who instigate violence amongst them. Further, the future lawyers were made aware of the undertrial process, the procedure that takes place inside the prison complex after conviction, what activities take place in jail, how violence is tackled by authorities and more.

The discussion came to an end and students were taken to the legal aid department where files and applications of inmates and other legal documents were kept. Followed by a peek into the lives of prisoners, law students made their way towards the cells of the inmates. Around their cells were idols

of Hindu Gods for worship purposes as practising one's religion is a fundamental right given in the Constitution of India. The condition of cells was believed to be overcrowded as the strength of at least fifteen people was made to live in a small room and sleep on the floor.

The last corner of Jail, the kitchen, too was presented to the students where inmates were seen preparing flatbread for officers and themselves. One peculiar thing to notice in the kitchen was the presence of stereo and allowance of listening to songs while preparing for lunch. Unlike the still and quiet atmosphere of the weaving factory, the kitchen could easily be considered a rather buzzing place for the inmates.

After observing the area around, the students were allowed to question and put forward their queries in front of Jail authorities. The discussion was technical and factual in nature consisting of the nature of jail, structure, facilities and working. Each and every place the students were taken to was given a brief description by the authorities themselves and it was to be noted that a very tight security measure was carried out by executives to ensure safety of all. The students enjoyed the visit thoroughly.

The Department of Legal Studies at Trinity Institute of Professional Studies organized a field visit to Police Station Dwarka South for the students of the second year of B.A.LL.B. on 11 August 2023. The purpose of the visit was to gain insights into the daily operations, procedures and functions of the police stations as well as to understand the role of the police in maintaining law and order in society and community.

The students were warmly welcomed by the police officers and they guided the students throughout their visit. Police Station Dwarka South is a local police station. The station appeared well organised with a clean and efficient layout.

During the visit, the police station officers gave the students an insight into the following resources they possess, like carrying Front Desk Operations where civilians can report incidents, seek assistance, or file complaints . Also the SHO of the police station gave a basic description of how criminal investigation is done once a crime is reported to the police station. The students were also shown the detention area where the detainees could be locked up for 24 hours.

The students also had a brief interaction with the IO who explained their role in investigation and solving crimes. They highlighted the importance of evidence collection, witness interviews and co-ordinating with other units. Students were told about filing FIR and filing the chargesheet in the court.

Police Station officers also informed the students about their community approach through organising workshops on crime prevention, awareness campaigns and partnerships with local schools. Also it is worth mentioning the police station has embraced technology for record-keeping and evidence management and communication.

The visit to police station provided valuable insights into the daily operations and functions of a local police station. The knowledge and experiences gained by the students by this visit would surely help them in applying this practical exposure while learning their criminal law lessons.
