FM Sitharaman's presented her First Interim Budget: Puffed-up and poll-ready budget, No changes in tax slab

New Delhi, February 1, 2024, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented the interim budget to the Lok Sabha. In the budget speech, she emphasised the Center's numerous schemes for women, youth, poor, and farmers. She said that the government lifted 25 crore people out of poverty in ten years.

In the budget, the government proposed to increase capital expenditure by 11.1% to Rs 11.11 lakh crore, reaffirming its commitment to infrastructure development. This represents 3.4% of GDP, which is excellent news for businesses involved in building and developing infrastructure.

The other good news is the announcement of a new housing scheme for the middle class. Rapid urbanisation, high property prices, insufficient affordable housing options, and a growing population have

led to housing shortages. The budget announcement promises millions of Indians the dignity of living in their own homes.

Some focus areas of this budget

The Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY) health insurance scheme will now be extended



to all accredited social health activists (Asha), Anganwadi workers, and helpers. The allocation for this public health insurance scheme has been increased from Rs. 6,800 crores to Rs. 7,500 crores in the interim budget. The scheme aims to offer a health cover of Rs. 5 lakh per family for secondary and tertiary care hospitalisation.

The announcement of longterm: Interest-free loans to states for the development of globally recognized tourist destinations is sure to boost tourism. Significant plans are also made in the works for port connectivity, airport development, and the enhancement of tourism infrastructure throughout the islands, including Lakshadweep.

Healthcare: A big chunk of the budget goes into making sure our healthcare system is strong. This means more money for medical research, building better hospitals, and getting the important medical things we

Help for small businesses: Small and medium-sized businesses are getting special attention. The government is making it easier for them with new rules on taxes and giving them financial support. This is crucial because these businesses play a huge role in how our economy works.

Environment-friendly: $money\,will\,be\,used\,for\,renewable$ energy and projects that are good for the environment. It shows India's commitment to global climate goals and creating a sustainable future. Government to raise subsidy for rooftop solar installation to 60%. The government is set to increase the subsidy for rooftop solar installations to about 60% under the new Pradhan Mantri Suryoday Yojana, Union Minister for New and Renewable Energy, R.K. Singh said on Friday.

FM Nirmala Sitharaman stated in her budget speech that she has not proposed to change any taxation. She has proposed to keep the same tax rates for import duties and indirect taxes, including direct taxes.

The budget for this year was not a regular government budget; rather, it was an interim budget. The interim budget contains detailed documentation of every expense to be incurred and every rupee to be earned through taxes in the coming few months until the new government comes to

UKD Assembly passes UCC bill **Live-in-Couples** needs to register

Dehradun, February 7, 2024 The Uttarakhand Assembly passed the uniform civil code (UCC) Bill and became the first legislature in independent India to pass a law that proposes common rules on marriage, divorce, inheritance of property, and live-in relationships for all citizens, irrespective of their religion. This stems from Article 44 of the Constitution (Directive Principles of State Policy) which although not enforceable, obligates the State to strive to implement such a uniform law. It will now be sent to the President for her assent after which it will become a law. The bill proposes a common law on marriage, divorce, land, property, and inheritance for all citizens irrespective of their religion in the state, excluding the Scheduled Tribes.

Highest Civilian Award 'Bharat Ratna' conferred to 5 Eminent Personalities

New Delhi, Honourable Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi announced on 9th February that former Prime Ministers PV Narishma Rao and Chaudhary alongside Charan Singh agricultural scientist Swaminathan will also be awarded Bharat Ratna. At the same time earlier politician and former Bihar Chief Minister Karpoori Thakur, former Deputy Prime Minister BJP Stalwart, Lal Krishna Advani were also announced to be honoured with highest civilian award. List of Bharat Ratna awardee this year

- Karpoori (posthumous): Bihar's former chief minister and a wellknown socialist leader will be posthumously honoured with Bharat Ratna. Popularly known as 'jan nayak' (people's leader), thakur will become the 49th recipient of this prestigious award.
- Krishna Advani:-Bharatiya janata party stalwart

and former deputy prime minister, has been associated with the party since its establishment in 1980. Apart from this Advani served as both the home minister and deputy prime minister under



the leadership of Atal Bihari Vajpayee from 1999 to 2004. Current PM Narendra Modi disclosed that Advani would be bestowed with India's highest civilian honour on 3 February, 2024.

Pamulaparthi Venkata Narasimha Rao (posthumous): Former Prime Minister, who passed away in 2004, will be conferred with Bharat Ratna, PM Modi announced on 9

February. Shri PV Narasimha Rao, a respected telugu leader, served a full five-year term as prime minister from 1991 to 1996 and is widely lauded for his pivotal role in introducing economic reforms.

- Chaudhary Charan Singh (posthumous): Another former Prime Minister and prominent jat leader hailing from western Uttar Pradesh will be conferred with Bharat Ratna. He is known for playing a pivotal role in spearheading anti-congress politics during an era when the party held dominant influence.
 - Sambasivan Mankombu Swaminathan (posthumous): Eminent agronomist will be the fifth person to be conferred with Bharat Ratna. Swaminathan is known for his significant contributions to agriculture and the welfare of farmers. He revolutionised Indian agriculture, ensuring both food security and prosperity for the nation.

Farmer protest update: Internet Services Suspended in border areas

New Delhi, The 2020 - 21 farmers protest basically gained importance and got featured in newspaper headlines since after facing the cold chill waves in winter farmers' demands were fulfilled and three agricultural laws were taken back by the government. According to the official data released by the farmers authority or committee over 700 farmers died due to this long one-year agitation protest. Over the past two weeks farmers are again on the road to protest against ignorance done by the central government over the discontinuity of laws passed in 2020-21 upon which farmer protest of 2020-21 was called. A delay by the central government in order to provide a fresh regime on minimum support price resulted in the beginning of farmer protest 2.0 - Delhi Chalo led by Samyukta kisan Morcha. But there is also a quite huge difference between

farmers protest 1.0 and farmers protest 2.0. This year's farmer protest has also gained a good political identity since some of the prominent leaders of politics for example Jagjit Singh Dallewal and Sarwan Padher Singh. At the same time this agitation lacks both strength and intensity since the majority of farmers are distancing themselves from this project and competing with each



other. Many farmers are also shying away to join the Delhi Chalo march since it is stopped by the Haryana police on two interstate borders. The previous farmers' protest gained support from various sections of society such as Hollywood, education sector, employees, students

UKD Assembly passes UCC Bill...

during the ongoing four-day special session of the assembly, which commenced on Monday.

The Uttarakhand Cabinet gave its approval to the conclusive draft of the UCC on Sunday. The proposed UCC aims to establish uniform civil laws applicable to all communities within the state.

Arjun Ram Meghwal, the Union Minister for Law and Justice, stated on Monday that the Uniform Civil Code is currently undergoing the consultation process and is under review by the Law Commission of India.

This development occurred A draft of the UCC was presented to the Chief Minister by a five-member committee led by retired Justice Ranjana



Prakash Desai. The UCC aims to establish a consistent legal

framework for marriage, divorce, land, property, and inheritance laws, regardless of religious affiliation. The passage

> of the UCC Bill fulfils a significant promise made by the BJP during the 2022 Assembly polls.

> implementation, this bill will provide benefits National integration and secularism which in

treats all religions equally, reducing communal conflicts promoting secularism,

secondly Gender Justice and Equality which assure granting equal rights to women in marriage, divorce, inheritance, Thirdly, Simplification and Rationalisation of Legal System in which It harmonises civil and criminal laws, enhancing accessibility for the common people. Lastly, Modernisation and Reform of Outdated Practices in which proposed Uttarakhand UCC bans polygamy, halala, iddat, triple talaq, and child marriage. It suggests a uniform marriage age for girls and mandatory registration of livein relationships.
