





She beat out perceived frontrunner Lily Gladstone, who has scooped up numerous awards for her role in Killers of the Flower Moon.

Hayao Miyazaki and Toshio

Suzuki's The Boy and the Heron was named best animated feature, while Jonathan Glazer's The Zone of Interest won the Oscar for best international feature. 20 Days in Mariupol won the award for best documentary.

Heading into the ceremony, Oppenheimer led the 2024 Oscar nominations, with the film nabbing a total of 13 noms, followed by Poor Things with 11, Killers of the Flower Moon with 10 and Barbie with eight.

Strict Action: Government bans 18 OTT platforms, 19 websites, 10 apps due to obscene and vulgar content

Social media across all the different applications and websites have 32 lakh users said by the Union I&B ministry.

These users consist of men and women of all age groups and it is the duty of the I&B ministry to protect sensitive young minds from explicit content, says Anurag Thakur, union minister of I&B.

Thus after an intensive discussion many multimedia managing authorities both government and private the I&B ministry decided to ban 18 OTT (over the top) platforms whose streams of different content have been blocked after they refused to react to multiple warnings regarding vulgar and obscene content of U-licensed manner.

Apart from these 18 OTT platforms, other 19 websites along with 10 apps were also banned for the same contempt

of broadcasting law of India. The platforms that were banned were Dreams Films, Voovi, Yessma, Uncut Adda, Tri Flicks, X Prime, Neon X VIP, Besharams, Hunters, Rabbit, Xtramood, Nuefliks, MoodX, Mojflix, Hot Shots VIP, Fugi, Chikooflix, Prime Play.

According to the research report of the ministry and other authorities, the above mentioned platforms disseminates their trailers through more prominent social media like Instagram and direct the users to their own websites.

This action taken by the government has made other platform users and providers to monitor their content more closely and try to legally maintain the decorum in their sites. It also informed the citizens about the dangers of using such sites to consume explicit content without any litigation done. It is advised to use more prominent content such as Netflix or Amazon prime to consume such

Action and Reaction:

The Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) passed in India in December 2019 sparked a wave of controversy and debate both domestically and internationally. The act, which offers expedited persecuted citizenship to minorities from neighboring countries but excludes Muslims, stirred concerns about discrimination and religious bias. Among the countries closely observing the developments was Pakistan, India's neighbor and historic rival. Pakistan's reaction to the CAA has been multifaceted, reflecting its complex relationship with India and its own internal dynamics. Pakistan's reaction to the CAA has been largely critical, viewing it as discriminatory and reflective of India's Hindu nationalist agenda under the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government. Pakistani officials, including Prime Minister Imran Khan, have vocally condemned the act, alleging it marginalizes Muslims and undermines India's secular credentials. They argue that by selectively granting citizenship based on religion, India is betraying the principles of equality and inclusion enshrined in its constitution. Pakistan is upset after the implementation of Citizenship Amendment Act-2019 in India. An official statement has come out from Pakistan on the Citizenship Amendment Act of India. Pakistan termed CAA as 'discriminatory' and said, this law discriminates among people on the basis of religion.

Office Pakistan Foreign spokesperson Mumtaz Zahra Baloch said in the weekly press conference, 'India's CAA law and its rules are clearly discriminatory on the basis of faith.' Mumtaz alleged that 'India's CAA law is made on the basis of misconceptions that minorities are being persecuted in neighboring countries and India is a safe place for them.'

Furthermore, Pakistan has expressed apprehensions regarding the potential repercussions of the CAA on regional stability. Given the historically fraught relations between the two countries, any policy perceived as discriminatory towards Muslims in India is likely to exacerbate tensions and fuel anti-India sentiment within Pakistan. There are concerns that the CAA could be exploited by extremist elements to stoke religious extremism and further destabilize the region.

Pakistan's reaction to India's Citizenship Amendment Act reflects the deep-seated tensions and complexities that characterize the Indo-Pak relationship. While Pakistan's concerns about the CAA's discriminatory nature and its potential impact on regional stability are valid, they are also intertwined with its own domestic challenges regarding religious minorities. Ultimately, resolving these issues requires constructive dialogue, mutual respect for sovereignty, and a commitment to upholding the principles of secularism and pluralism in both countries.
