Parliament Budget Session - Members raise issues of SC/ST, Online Gaming, Health in Question Hour

Union Minister for Information Technology Ashwini Vaishnaw told Lok Sabha Wednesday that 1,410 online gaming sites have been banned till now, considering the dangers of gaming, but added that state assemblies alone could ban or regulate the activity as gaming and betting were included in the State List of the Indian Constitution. The

in the House on Wednesday, with MPs from Punjab, Maharashtra, and Tamil Nadu seeking to know what the Centre was doing about it. Congress MP Amar Singh, who represents Rathgar Sahib in Punjab, said children, youths, and labourers are getting addicted to online gaming. He added that companies made algorithms that created an addiction towards gaming and dragged people into betting.

Vaishnaw replied that the Centre had taken multiple steps to control gaming and added that as per the Constitution, betting and gambling were part of entry thirty-four of the State List, and only state assemblies were empowered to make laws banning it. "State governments have the power to make a legislative framework for the same. Some states have also taken steps for it."

When Amar Singh asked how many children, youths, and labourers were engaging in online gaming, Speaker Om Birla wondered whether it was possible to count the same, with the minister concurring with the observation. When Congress MP Named Kirsan from Gadchiroli-Chimur in Maharashtra asked the same question, saying children were neither studying nor eating properly because of online gaming addiction.

Justice Yashwant Varma 'cash haul': Supreme Court refuses urgent mentioning of plea seeking FIR

A petition has been filed challenging a 1991 Supreme Court ruling that held that prior approval of the Chief Justice of India is mandatory to register a criminal case against a sitting High Court or Supreme Court judge.

The Supreme Court on Wednesday said that it had listed for hearing a petition seeking the registration of an FIR against Delhi High Court judge Justice Yashwant Varma over

the alleged discovery and removal of cash from his official residence during an accidental blaze on the intervening night of March 14 and 15.

"Your matter has been listed..." Chief Justice of India (CJI) Sanjiv Khanna told advocate Mathews Nedumaan as he requested the bench to hear it urgently. The CJI asked him not to make any public statements and added that he would get the date of the hearing from the registry. The counsel told the bench, also comprising Justice

Terrorists Strike in J&K's Kathua District

After massive search

operation, firing exchanged between the joint forces and the terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district. Officials said, "Contact has been re-established with militants in the forest area of Sufain under Police Station Rajbagh in Kathua. Security forces launched a search operation in the area during the early hours. According to initial reports, firing is still ongoing."

Massive searches, initially started in the Sanyal village of Hiranagar Tehsil, were spread to other adjoining areas as the terrorists had not responded to any speculative firing by the security forces after the initial exchange of gunfire on Sunday. A local woman informed the police on Tuesday that two men in Army uniform asked her for water while they were having food in the area. The search operation was carried out in multiple areas from Sanyal to Ding Amb and beyond,



covering several kilometres.

The operation, involving the Army, NSG, BSF, police, Special Operation Group, and CRPF, armed with technical and surveillance equipment, is supported by helicopters, UAVs, drones, bulletproof vehicles, and sniffer dogs. During the search operation on Tuesday, security forces recovered two grenades. The tracksuits found among a large cache of ammunition and other

materials in the Sanyal forests were identical to those worn by the four Jaish-e-Muhammad (JeM) terrorists killed in the Assar forests and Doda in June and August last year.

Local people in the area have joined the operation by security forces and urged those living in other areas to remain vigilant and report any movement of suspected persons. Several village heads have requested people to come forward with information about terrorist movements in their areas.

India offers US tariff cuts on Farm Imports, eyes trade success, Govt sources say

India has offered tariff cuts on imports of U.S. farm products like almonds and cranberries as a further concession to the United States, two government sources said, hoping to avert President Donald Trump's reciprocal tariffs set for next week.

Unlike China, Canada, and the European Union, India is actively seeking to appease the Trump administration and is open to cutting tariffs on over half of U.S. imports worth \$23 billion, Reuters reported earlier this week.

In a series of meetings in New Delhi with Brendan Lynch, the assistant U.S. trade representative for South and Central Asia, India agreed to cut tariffs on bourbon whiskey and agricultural products



such as almonds, walnuts, cranberries, pistachios, and lentils, one of the sources familiar with the discussions said. The talks to fast-track negotiations are likely to conclude late Friday.

Trade talks are "progressing well," and the bilateral trade pact, still in progress, will benefit both nations, Indian Trade Minister Piyush Goyal said on Thursday. "Securing

a favourable deal is a priority for Indian negotiators," a second government source said, adding that India has aligned its offers with U.S. priorities, particularly in the agriculture industry and some other sectors. Both sources spoke on condition of anonymity due to the sensitivity of the talks.

India's trade ministry did not respond to an email request for comment, while the U.S. embassy spokesperson in New Delhi said, "We don't have anything to share on private diplomatic discussions." India lowered duties for bourbon whiskey to 100% from 150% last month. Import duties range from 30% to 100% on agricultural products like cranberries, almonds, and walnuts, and around 10% on lentils.

Sanjay Kumar, that "the only thing (needed to be done is) FIR has to be registered against the judge."

The Supreme Court, in the 1991 ruling in K. Veeraswami vs. Union

of India, held that prior approval of the Chief Justice of India is mandatory for registering a criminal case under Section 154 of the Criminal Procedure Code against a sitting High Court or Supreme Court judge. The petition challenges this ruling, arguing that

"the consequence of the aforesaid direction, that no FIR shall be filed, was certainly not present in the



minds of the Hon'ble judges. The said direction creates a special class of privileged men/women, immune from the penal laws of the land."


