Pahalgam Terror Attack Sparks Renewed India–Pakistan Diplomatic Tensions

The recent terror attack in Pahalgam, a picturesque town in Jammu and Kashmir, has triggered a sharp escalation in diplomatic tensions between India and Pakistan. militants ambushed a bus carrying tourists near the

global forums to recognize and act against state-sponsored terrorism. Pakistan, on the other hand, has denied any involvement, terming India's accusations "baseless and politically motivated." Islamabad issued a counterstatement, claiming India is using the incident to divert attention from internal unrest in Kashmir. The attack and its

aftermath have once again exposed the fragility of peace efforts between the two nations. While the global community has largely supported India's call for justice, analysts warn that the escalation could derail recent backchannel diplomacy and regional stability. As both

sides dig in their heels, the prospect of renewed dialogue appears bleak, leaving the people of Kashmir and the subcontinent caught in a recurring cycle of violence and mistrust.

Apple's Strategic Shift: iPhone Production Moves to India Amid Global Supply Chain Recalibration

Apple Inc. has significantly ramped up its iPhone production in India, signalling a major strategic pivot away from its long-standing reliance on China. This move is part of the tech giant's broader effort to diversify its supply chain in response to geopolitical tensions, pandemicrelated disruptions, and rising labour costs in China. According to recent reports, Apple now produces nearly 14% of its iPhones in India. marking a substantial increase from previous years. The company has partnered with key suppliers such as Foxconn, Pegatron, and Wistronmany of which have established or expanded manufacturing facilities in Indian states like Tamil Nadu and Karnataka. This transition is also aligned with the Indian government's Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, which encourages foreign investment and domestic manufacturing in the electronics sector. India, with its large labour force and growing domestic market, offers Apple both economic and strategic advantages. Not only does this shift help mitigate risks associated with overdependence on a single region, but it also strengthens Apple's footprint in one of the world's fastest-growing smartphone markets. Analysts view Apple's



manufacturing hub. While China remains a critical part of Apple's supply chain, the increasing investment in India is expected to foster a more balanced and resilient global production network. Extradition of 26/11 accused Tahawwur Hussain Rana

The extradition of Tahawwur Hussain Rana, a key accused in the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks, marks a significant milestone in the pursuit of justice for the victims and their families. Rana, a Pakistani Canadian



businessman and close associate of David Coleman Headley, was brought back to India on April 10, 2025, after a protracted extradition process. The 26/11 attacks, which occurred on November 26, 2008, were a series of coordinated terrorist attacks that shook the city of Mumbai, killing 166 people and injuring hundreds more. The attacks, carried out by the Lashkare-Taiba terrorist group, were meticulously planned and executed, leaving a trail of destruction and chaos in their wake. Tahawwur Hussain Rana, a childhood friend of David Coleman Headley, is accused of providing support to the perpetrators of the 26/11 attacks. According to investigators, Rana had knowledge of the plot and aided Headley, who was involved in

for Rana was initiated in 2011, after he was arrested in Chicago for his involvement in the 26/11 attacks. After a prolonged legal battle, Rana's extradition was finally approved by a US court in 2020. The Indian government had been pursuing Rana's extradition for over a decade, and his return marks a significant achievement in the quest for justice. With Rana in custody, investigators can now grill him about his role in the attacks and gather more evidence to build a strong case against him. Murshidabad Erupts in Violence Over Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025

Murshidabad district in West Bengal witnessed a surge of violence in April 2025, as protests the newly enacted Waqf (Amendment) Act escalated into communal clashes, resulting in multiple casualties and significant property damage. The unrest began on April 11, when demonstrations opposing the Act turned violent in areas such as Suti, Dhulian, and Jangipur. Protesters reportedly set police vehicles ablaze, pelted stones at security forces, and blocked roads. The violence led to the deaths of at least three individuals and injuries to several others, including 18 police personnel. Authorities imposed Section 144 in affected areas and deployed the Border Security Force (BSF) to assist in restoring order. The Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025, has been a subject of contention, particularly among Critics Muslim organizations.



argue that the Act undermines the autonomy of Waqf Boards by allowing the appointment of non-Muslims to their panels and granting state officials authority to adjudicate disputes. Protests the Act have erupted in various parts of India, including Tripura

and Odisha, reflecting widespread discontent. In Murshidabad, the situation was further exacerbated by the involvement of political figures. West Bengal Minister Siddiq Ullah Chowdhury, who led protests the Act, faced criticism for allegedly

inciting violence. Reports indicate that during the demonstrations, flags of various Islamic countries were displayed, and saffron flags were removed from vehicles. intensifying communal tensions. The Supreme Court of India has expressed concern over the violence, describing the incidents in Murshidabad as "very disturbing." While no interim orders have been passed, the Court is set to continue hearings on the matter. As the region grapples with the aftermath, the Murshidabad violence underscores the deep-seated divisions and the challenges of implementing reforms in a diverse society.



In a landmark ruling on April 15, 2025, the Supreme Court of India issued stringent directives to combat the escalating crisis of child trafficking across the country. Expressing deep concern over the deteriorating situation, the apex court mandated that all child trafficking cases be tried and concluded within six months, emphasizing the need for dayto-day hearings to ensure timely justice. The bench, comprising Justices J.B. Sadriwala and R. Mahadevan, criticized the Uttar Pradesh government and the Allahabad High Court for their lax handling of a high-profile case involving the trafficking of a

newborn for ₹4 lakh. The court condemned the High Court's decision to grant bail to the accused, noting that several had absconded, thereby jeopardizing the trial. Highlighting systemic failures, the Supreme

Court directed that any hospital implicated in the trafficking of newborns should have its license immediately suspended. This measure aims to hold medical institutions accountable and deter negligence. The court also addressed the alarming situation in Delhi, where a trafficking racket involving several newborns was uncovered. The bench ordered the Delhi Police to intensify efforts to



apprehend the accused and recover the missing infants, expressing concern over the involvement of parents in such crimes. This decisive action by the Supreme Court underscores the urgent need for systemic reforms and vigilant enforcement to protect vulnerable children from exploitation. The directives serve as a clarion call for all stakeholders to prioritize child welfare and uphold the rule of law.

stepping up, CSK looks like a team


